May - June 2018 - <u>Delaware Bay Horseshoe Crab Survey and Tagging</u> - Moores Beach, NJ Important to remember:

 It's a very cool hands-on, Citizen Science data collection project,

- Vols are needed for documenting data, walking out measured rope lines, picking up crabs to count and even tag using cordless drills,
- You will get wet, it will be a late night (because you're driving home from just north of Cape May, you may not get home until 2:00 or 3:00AM),

A BioBlitz is an event where biology experts and volunteers gather to collect, identify, and catalogue every living thing on a demarcated property in a 24 hour period. Teams are formed, led by a team leader, to focus on particular categories of life, including Aquatic Insects, Birds, Plants, Fish, Mushrooms and Molds, Reptiles and Amphibians, Insects, Worms, Snails, Mammals, Mosses and Lichens.
